BACKGROUND AND APPROACH



- Dedicated community engagement team formed in Fall 2020
- Beyond community-focused work, the team is also responsible for advocacy, government relations, and volunteer programs.
- Primary objective: stewarding preexisting programs and building new ones with the goal of making the Symphony as accessible as possible.

ESTABLISHING AND GROWING RELATIONSHIPS



- We are guided by several key tenets:
 - Lead with curiosity, empathy, and flexibility.
 - Be as straightforward about any requirements and limitations we have as we are about what we *can* offer.
 - Approach any collaboration by centering the needs and goals of a partner (and the constituents they serve).
 - Research and be truly familiar with the mission, vision and values of a partner.
 - Assess any barriers to entry; address and remedy those barriers.
 - Always establish a first step or program with the intention of returning and growing the partnership.

OUR WORK, AT A GLANCE



- 32,000+ tickets distributed via the Free Community Ticket Program since its establishment in 2021
- 430 organizations partnered with since 2021
- 145 artists, dancers and community members collaborated in the 2023 Día de los Muertos concert
- 88 community organizations and groups represented at the 2023 All San Francisco concert
- Monthly free performances at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital
- Monthly free Community Chamber Concerts in 20 different San Francisco neighborhoods, and counting

DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS CONCERT OVERVIEW









This beloved annual event, first held in 2008, is rooted in community artmaking. It features a concert program of traditional and contemporary Latin American music, preceded by an array of family-friendly activities and altars designed by local artists and organizations.

Concert Event

 Since its inception, Día de los Muertos has been curated by Martha Rodríguez-Salazar a curator, teacher, choir director, producer, and director of musical and theater productions that celebrate Latin American culture in the Bay Area

Art Installations

 SFS commissions altars and art installations from local artists and organizations which are displayed in Davies Symphony Hall from mid-October to mid-November

CASA CÍRCULO CULTURAL







Casa Círculo Cultural is a grassroots, community-based multidisciplinary arts non-profit, dedicated to creating cultural programming reflective of the experiences of the Latino communities in the San Francisco Bay Area, while promoting leadership development for the whole family. Casa Círculo Cultural has collaborated with the San Francisco Symphony on the Día de los Muertos Celebration since 2010.

KEY ELEMENTS







- Theme: Establishing a specific theme each season guides the essence of the event, including the concert program and guest artists, commissions, installations, community partners, and activities
- **Music:** Working closely with Artistic Planning, conductor, curator, and partners rooted in the theme creates a more powerful connection between the music and the art



 Monthly concerts for patients, families, doctors, nurses, administrators, custodians of UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital




• Fully in-person concerts resumed in January 2023

 Virtual Music in the Wards concerts from July 2020 through December 2022




